36 °For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and <sup>3, p</sup>lose his own <sup>q</sup>soul? 37 Or what shall a man give in exchange for his 4, q soul?

38 Whosoever therefore shall be sashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the 'Son of man be ashamed, "when "he cometh in the glory of his WFather with the holy xangels.

31 Likewise also the chief <sup>l</sup>priests <sup>h</sup>mocking said among themselves with the "scribes, He saved others; himself he cannot

32 e, iLet Christ the King of Is'ra-el descend now from the kcross, that we may see and believe. And they that were \*crucified with him reviled him.

33 ¶ And when the csixth hour was come, "there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour.

34 And at the 'ninth hour Je'sus p,q,rcried with a loud voice, saying, t, u, v Ē-lō'ī, Ē-lō'ī, lā'ma sā-băch'tha-nī? which is, being interpreted, My God, my God why hast thou forsaken me?

35 And some of them that stood by, when they heard it, said, Behold, he calleth "E-lī'as.
